THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

Order made by the Governor under Defence Regulation 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 26th May, 1958, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 29th May, 1958, under Notification No. 337 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") His Excellency the Governor has authorized the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated at Larnaca town (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Gazette: Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1958), His Excellency the Governor has authorized the use of the said land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order for a further period of six months as from the 26th November, 1958.
