

✓ No. 45. THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 28th January, 1956, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 2nd February, 1956, under Notification No. 73 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorized the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated at Katholiki Quarter, Limassol (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months ;

And whereas by virtue of Notifications Nos. 642, 1284, 711, 1107 and 1021 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazettes* of the 12th July, 1956, 28th December, 1956, 18th July, 1957, 27th December, 1957, and 27th November, 1958, respectively, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 27th January, 1959 ;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months :

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Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1958), His Excellency the Governor has authorized the use of the said land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order for a further period of six months as from the 28th January, 1959.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1958), His Excellency the Governor has authorized the use of the said land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order for a further period of six months as from the 21st January, 1959.
