Cap. 288. 4 of 1952 1 of 1955 29 of 1956 28 of 1958. In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 2 (1) of the Pensions Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Pensionable Offices (Declaration) (Consolidation) (Amendment No. 2) Order, 1959, and shall be read as one with the Pensionable Offices (Declaration) (Consolidation) Orders, 1957 to 1959 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Pensionable Offices (Declaration) (Consolidation) Orders, 1957 to (No. 2) 1959.
- 2. In addition to the offices declared to be pensionable offices under the principal Order, the offices set out in the Schedule hereto are declared to be pensionable offices for the purposes of the Pensions Law.
