Rules of Court. 8. The Government of Cyprus will guarantee the estate of any infant or bankrupt or person, in respect of which estate any Official Trustee has been duly appointed, against any loss directly caused by the fraud of such Official Trustee.

9. Every Official Trustee shall have the same liabilities towards those interested in any estate in respect of which he is acting as he would have if he were not an Official Trustee. Every Official Trustee shall give such security to the Government of Cyprus for the faithful performance of his duties as the High Commissioner in Council may from time to time require and determine.

10. It shall be lawful for the High Commissioner in Council with the advice and assistance of the Chief Justice to make from time to time by Order in Council Rules of Court prescribing:—

(a.) The fees which shall be chargeable by Official Trustees in carrying out any of the duties hereinbefore referred to.

- (b.) The regulation of any matters relating to the duties of Official Trustees in carrying out any of the duties hereinbefore referred to.
- (c.) Generally the regulation of any matters required for the purposes of more effectively carrying out the provisions of this Law.

TO REGULATE THE GATHERING OF OLIVES AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE BETTER PROTECTION OF CERTAIN CROPS.

Short title.

Commissioner to fix date for gathering of olive crop to begin.

Penalty for gathering before date.

1. This Law may be cited as the Olives Law, 1899.

2. Every District Commissioner shall in each year fix the date at which the gathering of the olive crop shall begin in each village within his district or in each group of villages united under the provisions of the Field Watchmen Law, 1896,⁽¹⁾ and shall cause public notice of every date so fixed to be posted on the door of every church and mosque in the village or group of villages, or, should there be no church or mosque, in some conspicuous place.

3. Except in the case provided for in the next following section, any person gathering olives before the date so fixed shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one pound.

4. Notwithstanding the provisions of the last preceding section, Conditions any person may gather olives before the date so fixed, provided clives can be that he gives notice in writing of his intention so to do to the gathered Mukhtar of the village or, in his absence, to a member of the Village Commission.

Every such notice shall state approximately the quantity of olives intended to be gathered, and the situation of the trees from which the olives are to be gathered.

5. Nothing in this Law contained shall be taken to prevent the Windfallen collection of olives, which have fallen from the trees, by the owner olives. or other person entitled to collect them.

6. Any person who, between two hours after sunset and two Prohibition hours before sunrise, without having given previous notice to the gathering at Mukhtar or to a member of the Village Commission in the manner night. hereinbefore in this Law provided, gathers olives, whether before or after the date fixed for the gathering of the olive crop, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one pound.

7. Any person who between the hours specified in the last preced- Unlawful ing section carries or conveys any olives, carobs, sheaves, or other olives, etc. cereal produce shall, unless and until he proves that he has obtained possession of the same lawfully, be deemed to be in unlawful possession thereof, and shall be liable to the fine provided by the last preceding section.
