## A LAW TO AMEND THE LEPERS LAW.

DE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :--

Short title. Cap. 112.

I. This Law may be cited as the Lepers (Amendment) Law, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Lepers Law (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law").

Repeal of section 2 of the principal Law and substitution of new section.

" Governor may establish, etc., Leper Asylum and direct removal of lepers.

2. Section 2 of the principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor :---

2.—(1) The Governor-in-Council may, by Order to be published in the *Gazette*, appoint any place to be a Leper Asylum, for the segregation and treatment of lepers, and may, at any time, revoke any such appointment.

(2) Every Leper Asylum under this Law shall comprise such area as the Governor may, by Order to be published in the *Gazette*, define, and the Governor may, at any time, revoke, amend or vary any such Order.

(3) The Governor may direct the removal of lepers from one Leper Asylum to another, or, where any place has ceased to be a Leper Asylum under this Law, from such place to any other Leper Asylum appointed under this Law; and any person who fails to comply with any such direction shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months.".

3. Section 3 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein of the following sub-section (the existing part thereof being numbered as sub-section (1)):—

"(2) The Governor-in-Council may, by Order to be published in the *Gazette*, direct that the Leper Farm or Leper Asylum described in sub-section (1) (hereinafter referred to as "the existing Leper Asylum") shall, as from a date to be specified in the Order, cease to be a Leper Asylum under this Law:

Provided that no such Order shall take effect unless another Leper Asylum has been appointed under this Law, which, in the opinion of the Governor, is of equal utility to the existing Leper Asylum.".
